# **Concept Note**

Tourism is one of the most important sectors of the global economy, accounting for 5% of the global gross domestic product and supporting 235 million jobs. It is estimated that the number of tourists will increase to 1.8 billion by 2030. As far as Italy and Croatia are concerned, tourism is one of the most important engines for economic growth, accounting respectively for 7% and 20% of GDP, with significant impacts on the environment and society in all its aspects.

Therefore, the Embassy of Italy in Zagreb aims to promote an exchange of knowledge and experiences between the public and private stakeholders from Italy and Croatia, with particular focus on environmental sustainability in all its facets: from favouring nature-based and enogastronomic tourism supporting the local communities to the use of advanced technologies in terms of, for example, providing a digital boos to businesses, the deployment of renewable energy sources by accommodation establishments, and reducing waste through recycling.

On a global scale, the expansion of green-minded tourism is to be considered also in the context of the United Nation's 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, whereas more locally, Interreg, as one of the key instruments of the European Union's Cohesion Policy funded by the European Regional Development Fund, has been contributing significantly to the development of new solutions in various tourism-related initiatives in our Adriatic Sea, including bringing technical innovation into travel with respect to a green approach.

Therefore, the conference will address some aspects of intersectoral coordination necessary to render tourism sustainable without compromising the authentic experiences that out two countries offert to international tourists. It will draw on the knowledge of expert speakers from Italy and Croatia representing the public sector, the academic community and the business world. Overall, the tourism industry is a great opportunity for continued synergies between our countries.
